Dear Parents and Carers,

This has not been the half term we imagined. We had hoped to consolidate the recovery we saw in the autumn but instead we have faced a further lockdown with all its challenges.

We are now testing staff twice a week and so far all negative, and it gives me a degree of reassurance to know that I am not putting any staff or pupils at additional risk during the lockdown. The next big change will be the reopening of schools. We still have no firm commitment from the government about 8<sup>th</sup> March and it may not be a complete reopening.

Ash Wednesday falls on the Wednesday of half term and Mass will be celebrated in St Felix Church at 10 a.m. including distribution of ashes on Ash Wednesday morning. Online Mass will be streamed via the parish YouTube channel from the presbytery at 10 a.m. and 7.30 p.m.

After half term we are planning to hold our parent consultations digitally. This will be using School Cloud which we are in the process of setting up and we will send you details of how to login when this is completed. We hope to conduct appointments Mon  $1^{st}$  – Thurs  $4^{th}$  March. As most pupils are working from home we will be offering morning slots as well as late afternoon.

Congratulations to all those who have maintained the standards we expect in school despite the many challenges of limited access to devices, working from home and the sheer mundane boredom of all days feeling the same. Thanks to Aaliyah for your excellent musical contribution to our whole school assembly.

Online classroom Oak National Academy is now data free on mobile. All major mobile networks have made the site "zero-rated", meaning any family can access its lessons without any data charges or using any data limits, when accessed on a mobile.

The snow earlier this week was a nice boost to everyone's mental health and I hope you had a chance to get outside and enjoy it with your children. I hope you find something different to do over half term and your pancakes are all round and tasty!
