Ofsted Update

Area for Improvement 3 Improve reading curriculum by ensuring pupils enjoy a wide range of rich and varied texts and build their understanding of literature to effectively learn how to interpret and consider these texts.

This half term reading has been monitored for all pupils but with a focus on the first 20% of pupils. Little Wandle Keep Up and Catch Up programmes are having significant success across YrR-5.

Reading outcomes in class have been improved through adaptations to texts and pre-teaching for key pupils. Pupils speak positively about the texts they are reading.



On the last day of term 31st March, we will be undertaking our <u>CAFOD Big</u> <u>Lent Walk</u>. We would like pupils to wear something big alongside their normal school uniform for the walk which will take place on the field or playground depending on the weather. We will be aiming to walk at least 10 miles collectively as a school that day. It can be a hat, a bow, a pair of socks, sunglasses - anything bigger than they would normally wear.

We would ask that each pupil donates at least £1 which will go directly to CAFOD for their excellent work overseas. If your family circumstances dictate that this is not possible, we do understand and your child will not be disadvantaged in any way.

Internet Safety

Does your home have an open door to online child sexual abusers?

Increasingly, young people are being contacted in their own homes on online platforms and apps and asked for sexual pictures and videos, while their parents and carers are totally unaware.

There is a significant rise in children being groomed and coerced online by abusers into sexual activities often in their own bedrooms and bathrooms. Those abusers record this content via webcams or livestreaming services and share it across their networks online. This type of child sexual abuse is now the predominant type of sexual abuse imagery found on the internet.

This is happening now, and it can happen to anyone's child. But you can do something about it; **you can help prevent it** happening to your child:

TALK to your child about online sexual abuse. Start the conversation – and listen to their concerns.

AGREE to ground rules about the way you use technology as a family.

LEARN about the platforms and apps your child loves. Take an interest in their online life.

KNOW how to use tools, apps and settings that can help to keep your child safe online.
