Ofsted Update

As you are aware we had our first monitoring visit this week. We await the publication of the letter for parents which could be up to six weeks.

It would be helpful for you to have further information about this process.

When a school is judged to have serious weaknesses, they have a maximum of 30 months to demonstrate improvements. During this time, they receive up to 5 monitoring visits from Ofsted to check the school is making the desired progress. Once the HMI feels the school is ready, they can call a graded inspection to allow a school to be prove it should be regraded as either requires improvement or good.

Reading for Pleasure

A strong indicator of a child's success in their GCSEs is their reading attainment from an early age and this is influenced by their attitude to reading for pleasure.

Reading widely and regularly provides multiple benefits which extend beyond reading into the whole curriculum. Pupils who read for pleasure have a wider vocabulary and the gap between the number of words that pupils who read at home know compared to those who don't, widens rapidly and is difficult to close if the habit of reading is not established early.

Children are not restricted to the books they study at school or bring home to read to parents. Libraries are full of amazing texts for parents to share with their children and help them develop the reading habit. Listening to stories is not just for toddlers and can continue throughout primary school. At St Felix this term we have started class-based Book Clubs for all pupils to talk about the books they enjoy and have shared and you can help your child by sharing books at home so they can bring some fresh ideas to these sessions and influence the choices of others.
